# EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION FUND

The Excellence in Education Fund provides funding for classroom projects and supplies, CTE programs, scholarships and professional development. This year more than **14,000 students** were served through this fund.



# COMMUNITY INVESTMENT FUND

Through our CIF we collaborate with partners to provide responsive community improvement initiatives & programming in the southside of Tucson to connect neighbors, and catalyze growth and community investment.

#### Sunnyside Foundation + University of Arizona Southside Engagements 2023-Current

Beginning in 2023, Sunnyside Foundation and partners began engaging in activities to reactivate and preserve the cultural heritage of El Pueblo Neighborhood Center and fostering community engagement for future generations.

Together with stakeholders, the collaboration resulted in an ongoing portfolio of exchanges, including site-specific courses, community storytelling, arts-research projects, exhibitions and more, working to bring the Southside's cultural, historical and speculative imaginaries into the public eye. Drawing from a blended "urban humanities" research toolkit from urban planning, design and the humanities, these projects build on: case studies, visual literacy, archival research, mapping/site plans, site visits, community storytelling, spatial ethnography, pin-ups, community photo-shoots, image co-creation, co-curation, modeling, to name a few methods. A digital hub documenting this work is forthcoming in 2024. Lead partners include:

#### **Gabe Gallegos Memorial Foundation**



The Gabe Gallegos Memorial Foundation, founded in 2021, honors the memory of Gabe Gallegos by supporting the development of Tucson's youth, particularly in sports. This foundation provides resources to help young people grow and nurture their natural talents.

In 2024, the foundation extended its support to several young local athletes and programs; from soccer, pop warner football, wrestling and Little League baseball!

#### Familias Unidas Ganando Accesibilidad (FUGA)



FUGA had a dynamic year full of community building and advocacy. Through its bike programs & community outreach, FUGA has continued to invest with authenticity in our events and engagements geared toward uplifting the voices of the community in the intersections of mobility and accessibility. This is made possible through local partners Ward 1, Council Member Lane Santa Cruz, TUGO Bike Share and Saguaro National Park. This year, FUGA was awarded national grants to continue its mission and work in the areas of mobility justice. FUGA hosted bike clubs in 3 SUSD schools, working with more than 90 students and organized 24 community rides with more than 1,000 riders.
